Concurrently, Bermuda has a diverse workforce:

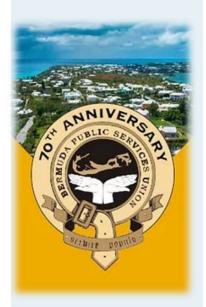
"The Changing Nature of Employment Relationship becomes the focal point" to propel workers to:
