

ROAD TRAFFIC ACT 1947

ROAD TRAFFIC (LIBERTY MUTUAL NATIONAL SPRINT TRIATHLON) (VARIATION OF SPEED LIMITS) ORDER 2025

The Minister responsible for works and engineering, in exercise of the power conferred by section 7(2A) of the Road Traffic Act 1947, makes the following Order:

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Road Traffic (Liberty Mutual National Sprint Triathlon) (Variation of Speed Limits) Order 2025.
- 2. This Order applies to the contestants and to the vehicles attendant on the contestants in the Liberty Mutual National Sprint Triathlon to be held on Sunday, 29th June 2025.
- 3. The speed limits fixed by section 7(2)(a) of the Road Traffic Act 1947 are hereby varied to the extent specified in the first column of the Schedule in respect of the contestants and the vehicles attendant on the contestants in the Liberty Mutual National Sprint Triathlon.
- 4. The relevant roads or parts thereof specified in the second column of the Schedule are hereby declared to be subject, at the times specified in the third column of the Schedule, in respect of the contestants and the vehicles attendant on the contestants in the Liberty Mutual National Sprint Triathlon, to the speed limit specified in the first column thereof.

SCHEDULE

SPEED LIMIT	ROADS	TIMES
75 kilometres per hour	Commencing near Point House on Front Street and traveling east along Front Street to East Broadway and Crow Lane, then turn left at the cut-through before Flora Duffy Hill and before the Crow Lane roundabout. Return to Hamilton in a westerly direction along Crow Lane, East Broadway and Front Street then make a right onto Bermudiana Road traveling in a northerly direction, then make a left onto Gorham Road traveling in a westerly direction, then make a left onto Woodbourne Avenue traveling in a southerly direction, then make a left onto Pitts Bay Road and continue onto Front Street. Racers will complete up to 5 laps, depending on the different race categories.	7:30am to 11:00am

ROAD TRAFFIC (LIBERTY MUTUAL NATIONAL SPRINT TRIATHLON)

The Minister responsible for works and engineering, in exercise of the power conferred by section 4 of the Road Traffic Act 1947, makes the following Order:

1. This Order may be cited as the Road Traffic (Liberty Mutual National Sprint Triathlon) Order 2025.
2. This Order applies in respect of the Liberty Mutual National Sprint Triathlon (the “bicycle race”) to be held on Sunday, 29th June 2025.
3. The bicycle race will follow the route specified below.
4. The Commissioner of Police is hereby authorized to close roads or portions of roads and authorize parking as the Commissioner of Police decides in the interests of public safety.

RACE ROUTE: Commencing near Point House on Front Street and traveling east along Front Street to East Broadway and Crow Lane, then turn left at the cut-through before Flora Duffy Hill and before the Crow Lane roundabout. Return to Hamilton in a westerly direction along Crow Lane, East Broadway and Front Street then make a right onto Bermudiana Road traveling in a northerly direction, then make a left onto Gorham Road traveling in a westerly direction, then make a left onto Woodbourne Avenue traveling in a southerly direction, then make a left onto Pitts Bay Road and continue onto Front Street. Racers will complete up to 5 laps, depending on the different race categories.

TRAFFIC CONTROL:

The bicycle race will commence on Sunday, 29th June 2025 at 7:30am and is expected to conclude by 11:00am. All motorists are required to use caution and to avoid collision with race participants. The race route will be under the control of the police and race officials. Motorists must follow instructions from race officials to assist with traffic control for this event.

ROADS CLOSED:

Roads will be closed during the races. Motorists are advised to use caution and alternative routes, giving priority to cyclists. Motorists are also advised to follow directions given by the police and race marshals.

PARKING:

There will be no parking restrictions in place for the bicycle race, with motorists permitted to park in designated parking bays along any part of the race route. Additionally, motorists must not block the race route or impede the participants in the bicycle race.
