

ROAD TRAFFIC ACT 1947

ROAD TRAFFIC (BERMUDA TRIATHLON ASSOCIATION CAMBRIDGE BEACHES BERMUDA TRIATHLON BICYCLE ROAD RACE) (VARIATION OF SPEED LIMITS) ORDER 2025

The Minister responsible for works and engineering, in exercise of the power conferred by section 7(2A) of the Road Traffic Act 1947, makes the following Order.

1. This Order may be cited as the Road Traffic (Bermuda Triathlon Association Cambridge Beaches Bermuda Triathlon Bicycle Road Race) (Variation of Speed Limits) Order 2025.
2. This Order applies to the contestants and to the vehicles attendant on the contestants in the Bermuda Triathlon Association Cambridge Beaches Bermuda Triathlon Bicycle Road Race on Ministry of Public Works Roads to be held on Sunday, 2nd November 2025.
3. The speed limits fixed by section 7(2)(a) of the Road Traffic Act 1947 are hereby varied to the extent specified in the first column of the Schedule in respect of the contestants and the vehicles attendant on the contestants in the Bermuda Triathlon Association Cambridge Beaches Bermuda Triathlon Bicycle Road Race.
4. The relevant roads or parts thereof specified in the second column of the Schedule are hereby declared to be subject, at the times specified in the third column of the Schedule, in respect of the contestants and the vehicles attendant on the contestants in the Bermuda Triathlon Association Cambridge Beaches Bermuda Triathlon Bicycle Road Race, to the speed limit specified in the first column thereof.

SCHEDULE

75 kilometres per hour	<p>The bicycle portion of all categories of the triathlon commences and concludes at the Cambridge Beaches Resort. The participants will turn left onto Cambridge Road and proceed north-east to Mangrove Bay Road junction where they will turn right and proceed south on Mangrove Bay Road to the junction of Somerset Road where they will take a left turn and proceed in an easterly direction on Mangrove Bay Road across Watford Bridge where the road becomes Malabar Road which they will continue on in a north-easterly direction where the same road becomes Cockburn Road. The cyclists in the 7 to 10 year old category will reach a turnaround point after Kitchener Road (before causeway) and will return the same way back to Cambridge Beaches Resort.</p> <p>The other participants continue along Malabar Road onto Cockburn Road, then onto Pender Road. Then turn left onto Smithery Lane, proceed to Camber Road and then onto Maritime Lane. Then turn right onto Dockyard Terrace, left onto Camber Road, and proceed onto Smithery Lane to Freeport Drive. The participants then turn left onto Pender Road, then onto Cockburn and Malabar Roads. The cyclists in the 11 to 15 year old category continue along to Mangrove Bay Road where they exit onto Cambridge Road and proceed to the finish line at the Cambridge Beaches Resort.</p> <p>Adult category will proceed to the turnaround west of Watford Bridge and return along Malabar, Cockburn, and Pender Roads to Dockyard. Then traverse the route through Smithery Lane, Camber Road, Maritime Lane, and Dockyard Terrace to Freeport Drive. Then exit left onto Pender Road and return to the finish line at the Cambridge Beaches Resort via the initial route.</p>	7:30am to 9:30am

**ROAD TRAFFIC (BERMUDA TRIATHLON ASSOCIATION CAMBRIDGE BEACHES
BERMUDA TRIATHLON BICYCLE ROAD RACE) ORDER 2025**

The Minister responsible for works and engineering, in exercise of the power conferred by section 4 of the Road Traffic Act 1947, makes the following Order:

1. This Order may be cited as the Road Traffic (Bermuda Triathlon Association Cambridge Beaches Bermuda Triathlon Bicycle Road Race) Order 2025.
2. This Order applies in respect of the Bermuda Triathlon Association Cambridge Beaches Bermuda Triathlon Bicycle Road Race (the "bicycle race") on Ministry of Public Works and Environment roads, to be held on Sunday, 2nd November 2025.
3. The bicycle race will follow the route specified below.
4. The Commissioner of Police is hereby authorized to close roads or portions of roads and authorize parking as the Commissioner of Police decides in the interests of public safety.

RACE ROUTE: The bicycle portion of all categories of the triathlon commences and concludes at the Cambridge Beaches Resort. The participants will turn left onto Cambridge Road and proceed north-east to Mangrove Bay Road junction where they will turn right and proceed south on Mangrove Bay Road to the junction of Somerset Road where they will take a left turn and proceed in an easterly direction on Mangrove Bay Road across Watford Bridge where the road becomes Malabar Road which they will continue on in a north-easterly direction where the same road becomes Cockburn Road. The cyclists in the 7 to 10 year old category will reach a turnaround point after Kitchener Road (before causeway) and will return the same way back to Cambridge Beaches Resort.

The other participants continue along Malabar Road onto Cockburn Road, then onto Pender Road. Then turn left onto Smithery Lane, proceed to Camber Road and then onto Maritime Lane. Then turn right onto Dockyard Terrace, left onto Camber Road, and proceed onto Smithery Lane to Freeport Drive. The participants then turn left onto Pender Road, then onto Cockburn and Malabar Roads. The cyclists in the 11 to 15 year old category continue along to Mangrove Bay Road where they exit onto Cambridge Road and proceed to the finish line at the Cambridge Beaches Resort.

Adult category will proceed to the turnaround west of Watford Bridge and return along Malabar, Cockburn, and Pender Roads to Dockyard. Then traverse the route through Smithery Lane, Camber Road, Maritime Lane, and Dockyard Terrace to Freeport Drive. Then exit left onto Pender Road and return to the finish line at the Cambridge Beaches Resort via the initial route.

TRAFFIC CONTROL: The bicycle race will commence on Sunday, 2nd November 2025 at 7:30am and is expected to conclude by 9:30am. All motorists are required to use caution and to avoid collision with race participants. The race route will be under the control of the police and race officials. Motorists must follow instructions from race officials to assist with traffic control for this event.

ROADS CLOSED: All roads along the race route will be closed to traffic while the bicycle race takes place.

PARKING: There will be no parking restrictions in place for the bicycle race, except at the turnaround location to the West of Watford Bridge. Motorists are permitted to park in designated parking bays along any part of the race route. Additionally, motorists must not block the race route or impede the participants in the bicycle race.
