The Ministry of Public Works and Environment wishes to advise the motoring public that temporary rolling lane closures will take place along Parson's Road to facilitate the installation of three (3) elevated crosswalks. The installation will take place Menday, October 27th, 2025 through Friday, October 31st, 2025. is ongoing through Friday, November 7, 2025.

The lane closures will occur from Two Way Mews to Field View Lane. The new elevated crosswalks will be installed at the following locations:

- Social Cycles Bermuda crosswalk
- Pembroke Park bus laybys crosswalk
- Just west of the Glebe Road crosswalk

These elevated crosswalks, similar in design to the one located near House of India on Union Street, are intended to enhance pedestrian safety and reduce vehicle speeds along the corridor.

The work hours will be weekdays from 7:30 am to 3:00 pm.

Traffic management will be overseen by Ministry of Public Works and Environment representatives, utilising cones and "Stop/Go" signs to ensure the safe flow of vehicles.

Motorists are urged to exercise caution when travelling along Parson's Road, both day and night, and to expect delays during the construction period.

To minimise disruption, drivers are encouraged to use detour routes via Marsh Folly Road or Happy Valley Road.

The Ministry of Public Works and Environment appreciates the public's cooperation and apologises for any inconvenience that may result, as we work to improve road safety.
