Survey Overview

Sample/Methodology

- Global Research interviewed a representative sample of 405 Bermuda residents aged 18 years and over.
- Surveys were collected online and via telephone interviews.
- All interviews were collected between November 13th-19th, 2020.

Weighting

■ The results were weighted to be representative of Bermuda's population on the following factors: gender, age, and race.

Margin of Error


■ The margin of error for the study is +/- 4.9% at the 95% confidence level.



Biggest Issue Facing Bermuda Today

■ Residents stated that the biggest issues facing Bermuda today were the economy (49%), unemployment (29%) and education (11%).

Impact of COVID-19 on Income & Employment

■ As a result of COVID-19, 42% had lost income, 27% had had hours cut or had been laid off from work, and 8% had lost their job.

Whether Residents Should Be Allowed To Engage In Non-Essential Travel During COVID-19

■ 52% felt that residents should not be allowed to travel outside of Bermuda for non-essential travel, compared to 48% who felt that they should be allowed to do so.

Whether Residents Plan To Travel In Next 6 Months

■ 23% stated that they plan to travel in the next 6 months compared to 77% who do not plan to travel.

Willingness To Take An Effective COVID-19 Vaccine

- 66% would be willing to take an effective COVID-19 vaccine, compared to 34% who would be unwilling.
- 15% would take the vaccine as soon as it was available, 28% would wait for 6 months to one year before taking it and 22% would wait for more than a year.
- Residents aged 55 years and over and whites were more likely to be willing to take an effective vaccine.
- Residents aged 18-34 years and blacks were less likely to be willing to take an effective vaccine.

Christmas Spending This Year

■ 63% stated that they plan to spend less this year, compared to 1% who stated that they plan to spend more, and 36% who plan to spend about the same as last year.
